TEACHER – ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

PRIMARY FUNCTION:

The position of Teacher – Elementary School, under supervision of the Principal, will provide a planned instructional program for elementary students following curriculum specified by District regulations; provide learning experiences to encourage maximum student growth using appropriate instructional materials; attend and participate in faculty meetings and other staff development to maintain professional competence; promote and maintain a safe, healthy and clean classroom environment that is conducive to student growth and responsibility; promote and maintain positive communication between students, parents and the Principal.

DIRECTLY RESPONSIBLE TO:

Site Administrator

ASSIGNED RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Organize, supervise, implement, and evaluate all instructional programs and activities within the assigned classroom in accordance to District-wide and School-wide policies and guidelines.
- 2. Establish high learning objectives, goals, and expectations for every student.
- 3. Develop lesson plans and instructional materials and provide individualized and/or group instruction in order to adapt the curriculum to the needs of students with varying abilities, attitudes, and cultural backgrounds, implementing the District and School guidelines, policies and goals.
- 4. Provide instruction to students with special needs in accordance with IEP, using support services as appropriate, and participate in IEP meetings as appropriate.
- 5. Evaluate student progress, keep appropriate records, prepare progress reports, and effectively communicate student progress with students, administrators and parents.
- 6. Administer, proctor, secure and submit State, District, and School standardized assessments following State, District, and School policies and regulations.
- 7. Provide a classroom climate and learning experience that will positively develop the emotional, physical, social, and mental development of the student.
- 8. Maintain proper control and discipline in a positive manner by establishing a good

rapport with and between students and others involved in the learning processes and in accordance with District policies and procedures.

- 9. Demonstrate sensitivity to various family and cultural patterns in planning classroom activities.
- 10. Maintain an attractive room environment and maintain high standards of classroom neatness as well as care for furniture, books, supplies, and other classroom equipment.
- 11. Work cooperatively with District staff, support personnel, local school staff, and parents to coordinate effective learning activities for students.
- 12. Plan and coordinate the use of volunteers, aides, teacher assistants, and other paraprofessionals when appropriate.
- 13. Supervise students in out of classroom activities during assigned work time, and assume responsibility for maintaining behavior standards school wide.
- 14. Participate in professional growth activities such as classes, workshops, conferences, school and District curriculum committees, and school community activities (for example advisory committees, PTA, youth organizations, etc.).
- 15. Ensure that students are not left in the classroom at any time without teacher supervision.
- 16. Adhere to all district health and safety policies.
- 17. Perform other related duties as assigned.

- d. Child guidance principles and practices.
- e. Applicable sections of the State Education Code, District Policies and other

applicable laws

- f. Current trends and research concerning the growth and development of children.
- g. Federal, State and District standardized assessment requirements.

• Ability to:

- a. Adapt plans and instructional delivery to meet the differentiated needs of students.
- b. Work independently with little direction.
- c. Create an instructional program and a class environment favorable to learning and personal growth.
- d. Monitor students in classrooms, on school grounds and off-campus for school related activities.
- e. Maintain professional and positive relationships with students, parents, colleagues and administration.
- f. Work in a diverse socio-economic and multicultural community.
- g. Operate a computer and job related equipment.
- h. Read, interpret, apply, and explain rules, regulations, policies, and procedures.
